# OUR CHURCH EVENTS

**Faith Storytelling:** Beginning sometime this summer, the elders would like to add a small element to our morning service entitled **"Three Minutes of Grace."** Essentially this will be a time in which a congregational member reads aloud a favorite Bible passage and then also briefly shares why these verses are so meaningful to them.
