OTHER CONCERNS:

Chaplaincy and Care: Hospice chaplains - Because of our aging society, a growing number of our chaplains are employed by hospice providers. But this is also a rich field for ministry, since the dying person is often left only with questions about God and eternity, along with concern for loved ones who will be left behind. World Renew: Laos - Por Ner wanted to try growing a crop he had never grown before. With World Renew's support he learned how to grow cardamom. His first harvest was a success, and he earned enough income to provide for his family. Race Relations: Unity and love - Pray that we all may hear the voice of the oppressed and speak boldly on their behalf. Pray that denominational restructuring of ministries may lead to greater unity and clarity for congregations, helping them to be missional and prophetic.
