World Renew and a partner, Beacon of Hope Initiative, have spent the past year conducting a campaign to help target preventable deaths. Led by trained educators, 495 Nigerian households learned about health care, nutrition, water sanitation, and hygiene. Please ask God to continue bringing healing and education to the families in this region.

Resonate Global Mission: North America - Pray for a woman struggling with health concerns as she faces the challenges of raising three grandchildren under the age of 10. She recently started attending a church plant and has been encouraged in her faith through members there. May the church continue to find ways to share Christ's love with her and help her become involved its ministry.

Race Relations: Training and discussion - Pray for our staff as they train and educate churches in becoming racially inclusive. Pray for upcoming Growing Pains book tour stops in Michigan and Iowa, focusing on the struggle of Lawndale (III.) CRC families to participate in Christian education in the 1960s and '70s. Pray also for efforts to train denominational staff toward becoming antiracist in our hiring and working practices.

World Renew: Uganda - In Uganda the Pentecostal Assemblies of God, a World Renew partner, created a Stepping Stones program in which local participants can discuss HIV/AIDS in a safe environment, sharing personal experiences and asking questions about the virus. Participant Akella Rose said, "In the Stepping Stones group, I gained confidence." Please pray for healing and wisdom for all who are affected by HIV/AIDS.

Urban Aboriginal Ministries: Homes - As winter approaches, the inadequacy of many rental properties and homelessness become pressing concerns. Pray for people who struggle to find safe, affordable housing, and pray for new approaches that will help end homelessness in Canada.

Resonate Global Mission: Nicaragua - The Kingdom Business program at the Nehemiah Center helps participants see the connection between the workplace and their faith. Fatima owns a business in Nicaragua and is a part of the program. Pray that through the training program she will continue to find new ways to live out her faith as she interacts in the marketplace and in her community.

Back to God Ministries International: India - Praise God that Mrs. Binita and her family recently accepted Christ. Binita had been ill and was encouraged to listen to our Hindi radio programs. She shared, "The Lord brings comfort through his divine love. I fully believe in the Lord Jesus Christ." Pray that the family's faith may grow and flourish.
