I wish all of you could personally experience the heartfelt appreciation we do as we dish up the plates and hand them to the grateful recipients. They seem to be amazed that complete strangers would be willing to do this for them. This is a much-needed, important ministry but things have changed both in our church and in our community causing new challenges to arise. We have seen over the past few months a rather sudden and large jump in the number of people coming in for a hot meal while, due to various circumstances, the core of cooks in our congregation preparing the meals has shrunk. The need in our community has grown so consequently, so has the need for people in our church to step up and allow this ministry to continue. Ways to address the new challenges are currently being considered but, in the meantime, today is a sign up Sunday. Please consider sharing the load by picking up a pan and recipe.
