



OTHER REQUESTS:

World Renew: (Mozambique) In Mozambique, 43 percent of children under age 5 suffer from chronic malnutrition. During the first 1,000 days of a child's life, their bones, muscles, and brain are taking shape in ways that will define their abilities even into adulthood. As World Renew works with church partners to change the story of hunger, pray for the resources needed to address the physical and spiritual health needs of these children and their families.

Chaplaincy and Care: (Military chaplains) Twenty-six CRC chaplains serve as military chaplains. Pray for their ministry, their family, and the service members they work with in this time of uncertainty, tension, and violence in our world. Our military chaplains are often on the front lines, providing pastoral care through counseling and prayer, and embodying the gospel message on military bases throughout the United States, Canada, Italy, Germany, Belgium, and South Korea.

Safe Church Ministry: (Teens) February is Teen Dating Violence Awareness month. The number of teens who experience sexual or physical abuse in dating relationships is staggering, more common than most people know. Teens struggle to navigate expectations and their own needs and vulnerabilities. Pray that churches can teach and model respectful, open, and healthy relationships and that youth will find the help they need.

World Renew: (Zambia) We continue to respond to severe drought in Zambia. Four thousand households are receiving in-kind food assistance across sixteen centers in Mwandi District. This critical and life-saving work is also being supported by the United Church of Canada, through our shared membership in the Canadian Foodgrains Bank. Praise God for the work of these partners and for the generosity of World Renew donors who help to make these efforts possible.

Resonate Global Mission: (Michigan) "We are hoping and praying for people we have been sharing the good news of Jesus Christ with to take the step of baptism this year," said a Resonate partner ministry leader in Michigan. Ask the Holy Spirit to lead these new believers into a deeper relationship with Jesus.

Back to God Ministries International: (India) Praise God for working in the life of Pawan, who came to faith in Christ after experiencing amazing physical healing. Pray that Pawan will continue to share his faith and testimony with the people in his village.
