# OTHER REQUESTS: (CRC Communications)

July 26, 2020 - (World Renew: Zambia) In many places around the world, hospitals and health facilities are not equipped with the resources to treat and prevent the spread of COVID-19. World Renew is helping to fill this gap in countries like Zambia by equipping frontline healthcare workers with personal protective equipment and educating communities in prevention techniques. Please pray for these hospitals and their communities.

July 25, 2020 - (Back to God Ministries International: Japan) Pray for people in Japan like Suri, who face many external pressures against visiting a church in a land where less than 2 percent of the population profess faith in Christ. "On Sundays, after a long, stressful week, it's hard to find the motivation to go to church," Suri shared recently. "Work and day-to-day life make it hard."

July 24, 2020 - (Resonate Global Mission: British Columbia) Pray for people who are part of discipleship groups with Resonate missionaries Ray and Angie De Lange in British Columbia. More people have joined since the start of the coronavirus pandemic. "Our people are yearning for relational connection as well as spiritual comfort and guidance," said Angie.

July 23, 2020 - (Safe Church Ministry: Safety) Please join us in prayer for people who are vulnerable in our communities. We think of children who are living in abusive family situations right now, unable to escape their current situation. We think of partners who are living in abusive relationships that are not able to leave. Distancing within communities to flatten the curve can have major consequences for persons living in volatile situations.

July 22, 2020 - (Back to God Ministries International: Indonesia) Setia, a radio listener in Indonesia, asks for prayer as she and her family endure the effects of COVID-19. Pray for her physical health. Setia's high blood pressure and work situation make her especially vulnerable to contracting the virus.

July 21, 2020 - (World Renew: India) Many people in impoverished regions of countries such as India do not have ready access to clean water, soap, enough food, and advanced health care. As a result, they have a higher risk of catching and spreading the virus. As World Renew and its partners are hard at work to prevent and reduce the transmission of COVID-19, please ask for God's protection for the world's most vulnerable people.

July 20, 2020 - (Diaconal Ministries Canada: Stewardship) During these difficult times when congregations aren't gathering in their usual spaces and usual ways, please pray for your deacons as they strive to equip and encourage your congregation to love God and others and care for creation through the wise stewardship of all of God's gifts (1 Pet. 4:10).
