Resonate Global Mission: (Church planters) As people who generally thrive on personal relationships, church planters spend a lot of time meeting people in their community. As a result, the COVID-19 pandemic has made their work especially challenging. Ask God to keep them from being discouraged, and pray that they may be creative and inspired in the work they are doing.

Office of Race Relations: (Responding) Since the death of George Floyd, our staff responding to requests for help have faced congregants, pastors, and ministry leaders affected by the tragedy. Some are dealing with deep sadness and hurt/anger, while others are sensing a personal threat to their views and values. Pray that everyone senses Christ's embrace and embraces their neighbors.
