**Psalm 107:1-3:** <sup>1</sup> Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; his love endures forever. <sup>2</sup> Let the redeemed of the LORD say thisthose he redeemed from the hand of the foe, <sup>3</sup> those he gathered from the lands, from east and west, from north and south.

**Psalm 107:4-9:** 4 Some wandered in desert wastelands, finding no way to a city where they could settle. <sup>5</sup> They were hungry and thirsty, and their lives ebbed away. <sup>6</sup> Then they cried out to the LORD in their trouble, and he delivered them from their distress. <sup>7</sup> He led them by a straight way to a city where they could settle. <sup>8</sup> Let them give thanks to the LORD for his unfailing love and his wonderful deeds for men, <sup>9</sup> for he satisfies the thirsty and fills the hungry with good things.

Psalm 107:10-16: <sup>10</sup> Some sat in darkness and the deepest gloom, prisoners suffering in iron chains, <sup>11</sup> for they had rebelled against the words of God and despised the counsel of the Most High. <sup>12</sup> So he subjected them to bitter labor; they stumbled, and there was no one to help. <sup>13</sup> Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble, and he saved them from their distress. <sup>14</sup> He brought them out of darkness and the deepest gloom and broke away their chains. <sup>15</sup> Let them give thanks to the LORD for his unfailing love and his wonderful deeds for men, <sup>16</sup> for he breaks down gates of bronze and cuts through bars of iron.

Psalm 107:17-22: <sup>17</sup> Some became fools through their rebellious ways and suffered affliction because of their iniquities. <sup>18</sup> They loathed all food and drew near the gates of death. <sup>19</sup> Then they cried to the LORD in their trouble, and he saved them from their distress. <sup>20</sup> He sent forth his word and healed them; he rescued them from the grave. <sup>21</sup> Let them give thanks to the LORD for his unfailing love and his wonderful deeds for men. <sup>22</sup> Let them sacrifice thank offerings and tell of his works with songs of joy.

Psalm 107:23-32: <sup>23</sup> Others went out on the sea in ships; they were merchants on the mighty waters. <sup>24</sup> They saw the works of the LORD, his wonderful deeds in the deep. <sup>25</sup> For he spoke and stirred up a tempest that lifted high the waves. <sup>26</sup> They mounted up to the heavens and went down to the depths; in their peril their courage melted away. <sup>27</sup> They reeled and staggered like drunken men; they were at their wits' end. <sup>28</sup> Then they cried out to the LORD in their trouble, and he brought them out of their distress. <sup>29</sup> He stilled the storm to a whisper; the waves of the sea were hushed. <sup>30</sup> They were glad when it grew calm, and he guided them to their desired haven. <sup>31</sup> Let them give thanks to the LORD for his unfailing love and his wonderful deeds for men. <sup>32</sup> Let them exalt him in the assembly of the people and praise him in the council of the elders.

**Psalm 107:43:** <sup>43</sup> Whoever is wise, let him heed these things and consider the great love of the LORD.
