Tonight's "Blue Christmas" service is specifically intended for those who are experiencing grief over loss. Whether it be the loss of a loved one, declining physical health, emotional anxiety, financial insecurity, etc. – nearly every human being has experienced some sort of grief over loss. The year 2020 itself has been filled with lament and loss for all of us.

The purpose of tonight's service is to create a sacred space for those who are grieving this holiday season. "Blue" services are intended to be thoughtful and meditative as together we reflect more deeply on the main reason for Christ's incarnation. The purpose of the service is to offer a message of hope and an assurance of God's presence in the midst of our darkness.

Generally speaking, this service often takes place on, or near, December 21 and is sometimes referred to as "The Longest Night Service." This particular service was adapted from previous services that took place both at Grace Community CRC in Oak Lawn, IL under the direction of Pastor Michael Kooy, Diane Ritzema, and Pastor Erik Kamp; and also at The Cathedral Church of Saint Andrew in Honolulu, HI. We are grateful for their work in planning this service and also for giving the broader Church permission to adapt and use it. May God bless us as we worship Him together this evening.

Tonight, we entrust them to Jesus Christ, the suffering Servant who is victorious over death itself. We remember that the dawn overcomes the darkness.
