

2021 Synod - Human Sexuality Report: Due to the rapidly changing sexual mores within our culture today – the 2016 Synod (the annual general assembly of the Christian Reformed Church) commissioned a study committee to articulate a "Biblical Theology of Human Sexuality" to be used as guidance for churches in our denomination. Five years later (not so 'rapid') this report is completed and will be presented at the 2021 Synod. Recently the elders have been reviewing this report and for the most part have been encouraged by the tenor and wisdom of the report itself. It's also one of the main reasons for our current sermon series on the Song of Songs.
