Dear Friends,

I suspect that when most of us first attempted to read the Song of Songs one of our initial reactions was, "What in the world is **this** doing in the Bible!?" No doubt a second common question was "What on earth is this about!?" When it comes to reading this particular book of the Bible most of us can probably identify with the confusion of the Ethiopian eunuch when Paul asks him, "Do you understand what you are reading?" (Acts 8:30).

Yet, in a world that often both worships sex and also treats it as something dirty — the Song of Songs provides a much needed corrective. It seems to communicate that passionate physical love is a beautiful gift from God. Not only does it demonstrate that the Bible is not 'anti-sex,' but it also demonstrates that biblical sex is to be celebrated with gratitude to God who made us in His image.

In short, the Song of Songs is not only a beautiful love poem, but also a parable about human love that invites us to also reflect deeply on the relationship between Christ and His followers. In other words, it gives us the opportunity to reflect on our own intimate relationship with Jesus. And therefore, certainly one practical question we should keep in front of us throughout the weeks ahead is simply this: "Are we striving to love the Lover of our soul (Jesus) with the same kind of eagerness, anticipation, and passion as we see expressed here in the Song of Songs?"
