Matthew 17:1-9: ¹After six days Jesus took with him Peter, James and John the brother of James, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. ²There he was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as the light. ³Just then there appeared before them Moses and Elijah, talking with Jesus. ⁴Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here. If you wish, I will put up three shelters--one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah." ⁵While he was still speaking, a bright cloud enveloped them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased. Listen to him!" ⁶When the disciples heard this, they fell facedown to the ground, terrified. ⁷But Jesus came and touched them. "Get up," he said. They spoke about his departure, which he was about to bring to fulfillment at Jerusalem. ³²Peter and his companions were very sleepy, but when they became fully awake, they saw his glory and the two men standing with him. ³³As the men were leaving Jesus, Peter said to him, "Master, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters--one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah." Congregational Singing Plans: The Elders would like to express their gratitude for the countless ways many of our congregational members have strived to live out Christ-like grace and patience towards one another throughout this past year. In doing so, you have genuinely been a living testimony of God's grace to us. We are so thankful for the unity that is present in our church family throughout such a difficult season.

It probably goes without saying that one of the more challenging topics of recent elder's meetings is whether to continue to adhere to current government guideline restrictions regarding congregational singing. As elders, we certainly always want to protect the health of our church family. Yet, provided there is a diligent use of masks and physical distancing - we also believe that congregational singing does not pose a significant increase in risk. In addition, now that more and more vaccinations are being administered we feel the risk is even less.

Therefore, we continue to encourage you to wear masks at all times in the church building and especially as we begin to sing together.
