- 3. We request that First CRC congregational members continue to wear masks until the state restrictions are lifted this may take place before the end of June.

These decisions were not taken lightly, but they were wrestled with – the desire to pursue unity and care for one another is utmost.

In the meantime, please continue to keep in prayer those who are suffering with the virus and its effects. While many places in the world are now doing quite well — there are also many places that are not. In our own setting it certainly appears like we are nearing the end of the current restrictions. Dear Friends.

Around the world today many Christians still endure severe persecution. Here in the United States we are fortunate that physical persecution is rare. However, many of us are familiar with cultural pressure and/or oppression.

In the book of I Peter, the apostle Peter reminds us that Christians are *aliens* and *exiles* in an often-hostile empire. Yet, at the same time, we are also chosen by God and equipped by Jesus' work 'for' us and 'in' us to live faithfully in our dual identity.

In the weeks to come we will explore how the work of Christ enables us to live with hope, joy, and faithfulness in an often antagonistic world. Peter reminds us that the kind of life that pleases God is one that includes respect for authorities (even when they are unjust!); godly behavior in the home; and by God's grace – good deeds, courage, and a firm faith in the midst of life's trials.

ORGANIZATIONS WE SUPPORT

MINISTRY OPPORTUNITY: "Underground Ministries" is a local ministry that seeks to support those coming out of prison as they reenter into society. Part of their ministry model is to match one prisoner with a core group of 5-7 members of a local church to walk alongside and support them upon their release from prison. The relationship itself already begins approximately 12-18 months before the inmate is released by way of letters, emails, and Zoom meetings. The hope is that the relationship will then continue well after the release date itself. The Evangelism Committee has recently received the blessing from council to become a "One Parish/One Prisoner" support team

and to also begin to gather a 'core group' of First CRC members who are feeling led by God to play an active role in this ministry. Thus, if you sense God calling you to this role, or would like to know more about it – please contact Darrel Lagerwey or Pastor John in the weeks ahead.

DEAR FAITHFUL PARTNERS OF PREGNANCY CHOICES: Our last day in our current building will be May 31st. Our new location is less than three blocks from Planned Parenthood at 110 N.15th Street in Mount Vernon. Since our new building is not ready, we have made some adjustments in the delivery of our services. , Pregnancy Choices is changing its name to C.A.R.E. Medical Center. New services will include STI testing and treatment for both men and women as well as the Abortion Pill Reversal for women who have taken RU486 also known as the Abortion Pill. We will continue to keep Pregnancy Choices as our registered name through the IRS but DBA C.A.R.E. Medical Center.
