Dear Friends,

Around the world today many Christians still endure severe persecution. Here in the United States we are fortunate that physical persecution is rare. However, many of us are familiar with cultural pressure and/or oppression.

In the book of I Peter, the apostle Peter reminds us that Christians are *aliens* and *exiles* in an often-hostile empire. Yet, at the same time, we are also chosen by God and equipped by Jesus' work 'for' us and 'in' us to live faithfully in our dual identity.

In the weeks to come we will explore how the work of Christ enables us to live with hope, joy, and faithfulness in an often antagonistic world. Peter reminds us that the kind of life that pleases God is one that includes respect for authorities (even when they are unjust!); godly behavior in the home; and by God's grace – good deeds, courage, and a firm faith in the midst of life's trials.

July 4, 2021 - (ReFrame Ministries: China) Two of our largest WeChat channels were shut down recently, leaving about 240,000 followers without access to devotions and other biblical content. This came as part of a broad wave of restrictions on Christian content by the government. Pray that people in China may find other Christian resources online, including some of ReFrame's other social media channels.

July 3, 2021 - (Safe Church Ministry: Webinar) Safe Church works with a vision that one day our churches will be free from abuse. As we work toward this goal, our ministry continues to bring in experts to share how to prevent and address abuse.
