Will you help Haitians left homeless after the earthquake? - On August 14th an earthquake shook Haiti and has so far claimed over a thousand lives, left thousands more injured or missing, destroyed property, and compounded the suffering of the island nation that has been struggling with economic instability. The Haitian healthcare system is ill equipped to tend to all the injured. An estimated 30,000 people have been left homeless—exposed to the elements including the wind and rain that Tropical Storm Grace brought down just days after the earthquake. The World Renew Haiti team has been connecting with partners in the area and is coordinating with other humanitarian organizations to deliver emergency supplies to families left homeless by the earthquake. Our initial response includes nonfood items like tarps for shelter and kits containing household and personal care items. To donate visit: worldrenew.net/haiti
