

Christmas Blessing: The Evangelism Committee would like to do a small church project for the purpose of blessing our neighbors. Thus, this year we will be making "Christmas Cookie Jars." Essentially these are decorative mason jars filled with the ingredients for making holiday cookies. I suspect when most of us think about the book of Daniel we immediately recall the stories of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego in the fiery furnace and Daniel in the lion's den. Such stories are often taught in a way to provide us a model for how to live for Christ in a hostile world. Certainly that is an important part of their purpose.

Yet, the reality is, very few of us can really claim to come close to such a standard. As sinners, we often fall miserably short. Which is precisely why the book of Daniel points us to someone even greater who also lived a life of exile and separation. His name, of course, is Jesus.
