— through the name of Jesus Christ, our Lord, who with the Father and the Holy Spirit, abides with us, one God now and forever.

People: Come, Lord Jesus.

Reader #2: O Wisdom, your words uttered in the beginning generated a world of beauty and goodness, giving purpose and value to each creature; instruct us in the way of prudence, that we may nurture the world with justice and joy.

Help us to resist evil and to obey you, so that we may walk in your ways and the beauty of your creation may flourish—through the one whom we know as the Wisdom of the ages, even Christ, our Lord.

People: Come, Lord Jesus.
