- A. That I am not my own, <sup>1</sup> but belong—body and soul, in life and in death—<sup>2</sup> to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ. <sup>3</sup> He has fully paid for all my sins with his precious blood, <sup>4</sup> and has set me free from the tyranny of the devil. <sup>5</sup>
  He also watches over me in such a way <sup>6</sup>
  that not a hair can fall from my head without the will of my Father in heaven; <sup>7</sup>
  in fact, all things must work together for my salvation. <sup>8</sup>

Because I belong to him, Christ, by his Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life<sup>9</sup> and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him.<sup>10</sup>
